
National Empowerment Project Update August 2014

Cultural, Social and Emotional Wellbeing Program

Our two Queensland sites delivering the program, Cherbourg and Kuranda have nearly completed delivery of the first program to approximately 20 participants in each site.

We would like to take this opportunity to congratulate, Kate, Biri, Barbara, Bronwyn and James on their work delivering the program to their local communities. The informal feedback that we have received notes that participants have been really enthusiastic and have found the program to be immensely beneficial to them. Along with participants, the consultants have expressed how much they have enjoyed delivering the program and that they can see benefits to participants, along with participants expressing this. The program will be formally evaluated and outcomes will be communicated to all. The program will be delivered to a new group of participants in both communities in a few weeks.

Kate has happily handed over the coordinator role to Glenis Grogan who will be coordinating the program in both Cherbourg and Kuranda under the auspice of Ngoonbi. We take this opportunity to thank Kate for her fantastic work not only in assisting with program delivery but also with the development of the program. Kate won't be too far away from us all!!
